- Are you willing to make the time commitment?
- Is a Master's degree required for your job/industry of choice?

Specific questions about graduate programs:

- What schools/cities are you considering?
- What type of program are you looking for?
- What is the duration of the program?
- How many hours are required?
- What are the classes and when are they scheduled?
- How much does the program cost?
- How the department setup and how is the faculty?
- What is unique or what do you like about the program?
- What are some concerns regarding the program?
- What entrance exam is required?
- What are the average GPA and exam scores?
- What is needed for the application process?
- What is the timeline for applying? Is it rolling admissions?
- What are the profiles of previous classes?
- Have you researched scholarship or assistantship opportunities?
- What is the employment rate after completing the program?
- What types of jobs are available post-graduation?
- What companies recruit from this program?

- ✓ Create a comparison chart between schools/programs you are considering
- ✓ Consider your goals and if graduate school will help you achieve these goals
- ✓ Research the school's website first because most information can be found here
